

Agrifood policy expenditures (2006-2016)






Impact of agrarian subsidies on efficiency

Models: production function, production factors

The reduction of labor resources - incentives for technological modernization. This situation can be considered normal under two conditions: first, if state support is accompanied by other positive effects; secondly, if problems of employment of the released workers are solved.
